RUHS and Koita Foundation Collaborate to Launch Digital Health Foundation Course for Medical Students Across Rajasthan

Rajasthan University of Health Sciences (RUHS), Jaipur and Koita Foundation have signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to launch the Digital Health Foundation Course (DHFC) for medical students and healthcare professionals across the country. Designed by subject matter experts, the 13-module online course combines conceptual clarity with practical exposure through a virtual Digital Health Lab (DHL). This lab offers learners access to demo platforms for EMRs, HMIS, and telehealth tools—ensuring they gain real-world familiarity with the digital systems used in modern healthcare delivery.

RUHS includes a wide network of students and faculty across over 600 affiliated colleges. The Digital Health Foundation Course will be offered through the RUHS website. The course is open to not just RUHS affiliated students but students and other healthcare professionals across the country who wish to strengthen their digital competencies. Upon successful completion, participants will receive a certificate and 2 academic credit points from RUHS.

Shri Gajendra Singh, Hon'ble Health Minister, Government of Rajasthan, said: "Digital health is central to improving access, quality, and efficiency in healthcare. Equipping our medical students with these skills is a necessary investment in the future of the country's healthcare system. I congratulate RUHS and Koita Foundation for taking this important step."
